From our Pastor....

(revisiting an old issue)

My mother used to have a magnet on her frig that read, "Nothing will happen to me today that God and I can't handle together." Anyone who knew my mom knows that that was a pretty good description of her. She had a dynamic and trusting faith. Even so, all of us, no matter how strong our faith is; occasionally come up against things that just seem to be too much for us. So what do you do when the battle is bigger than you are? What do you do in those times when it just seems like there isn't enough faith to go around? I don't have all the answers, far from it. but I can make some suggestions.

First, **remember that the Lord wants to help.**

There was a time in Jesus' ministry when he was grieving and tired. He just wanted to get away. So he crossed the sea, determined to get away for a while. But even before he could get off the boat, people were lined up for help. Some wanted healing, others words of encouragement, some were just curious. Imagine Jesus, tired and grieved, needing time to himself, and yet he stopped what he was doing in order to heal and feed and help them. That is a God who wants to help!

Second, **when you don't know what to do; wait.**

Over the years, I have discovered that most of the time I have a pretty good idea of what to do in a situation, and when I don't, it's a sure sign that I need to wait on the Lord. If what you are dealing with seems too large to handle and you have no idea what to do next, wait.

Third, **remember and recognize the power of God.** The one to whom you turn with your problem is the same one who raised Jesus from the dead (not to mention, set the universe in place, parted the waters, led the people out of Egypt and jillions of other powerful things). If God could do all of that, what do you think the chances are that

God can help in your situation?

Fourth, **try not to dictate to God what you will accept as an answer to the problem.** Sometimes the things that we think we want are not what is best for us and so God will not grant them. Trust God to know what you really need.

Fifth, **don't feel singled out.** Your pain is yours and it is as important as anyone's pain but it is also not completely unique. You can always find someone who is better off and someone who is worse off, so remember, you have not been singled out to suffer more than anyone else around you.

Sixth, **remember that you are not alone.** In John 16:13 Jesus promised to send the Holy Spirit. When the Spirit comes to you, you are not alone even if there isn't another person around for as far as the eye can see. You never have to suffer alone and you shouldn't. Furthermore, Paul said that believers "bear one another's burdens" so don't hesitate to seek out other believers to support you as well.

Seventh, **don't stop doing the things that nurture and help.** Suffering is not the time to stop coming to church, reading the Bible or praying. You need the presence of other believers to lift you up, the Word to sustain you, and conversation with God to keep you centered more than ever.

Eighth, **pray.** Pray a lot. Pray more than ever. Pray for whatever you need or want. God will always listen. But mostly, pray for the presence of the Holy Spirit to be with you to give you courage and strength and to help you get through this. And **ask others to pray for you too.** It's part of how we bear one another's burdens.

I know that there are a lot of other things that could be said. Maybe some day I'll think of them, but for now, I hope these things help. And by the way, if you are dealing with something that's just too big to handle remember, "Nothing will happen to you today that God and you can't handle together." Because it's true!

DESIRE OF ALL NATIONS, so I will passionately proclaim your truth &

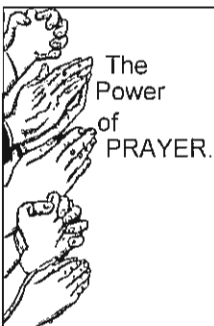
beauty every place, expressing to others the delight I have found in you.

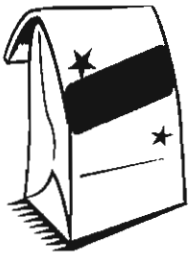

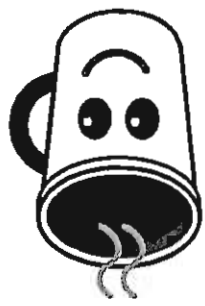
