From our Pastor....

"I just can't seem to forgive him," she said. It was matter of fact, not so much angry as sad, not so much justifying as trapped. I hear it often. I understand it. But I know that it hurts us.

Why do we have so much trouble forgiving?

At least part of the problem may be a misunderstanding of what it means to forgive. So let's look first at what forgiveness is not. **Forgiveness is not forgetting.** The saying, "forgive and forget" isn't Biblical, nor is it practical. If we could forget it, we wouldn't need to forgive it. Forgiving is what we do in spite of the fact that we cannot forget. **Forgiveness is not condoning.** Forgiveness is what we do in spite of the fact that we do not condone what someone did. We never have to think that something that wronged us was all right, right, acceptable, even understandable. We might develop empathy for how and why the person did what they did, we might seek to understand their point of view of what happened, but we never have to try and make a wrong into a right.

Forgiveness is also not a warm fuzzy. When we forgive someone we don't have to suddenly start thinking warm thoughts about them. We may not ever like or trust them.

Another difficulty is that we live in a culture that encourages us to get even rather than to forgive. "I never get mad, I get even," and "revenge is sweet" permeate the way we are often encouraged to think about those who have hurt us. We see it in everything from a quickness to litigate to the contentiousness of politics. The problem is that revenge *isn't* sweet. While we are waiting for it, it keeps us consumed. It eats at our souls. It makes us out of sorts with others. And when we finally get it we usually discover that it isn't all that satisfying after all. The Chinese say that it digs two graves, one for the person we hate and the other for us.

So how can we understand forgiveness and what do we do to forgive? First, **forgiveness is letting go of our perfect right to revenge.** That is, even if we have a right to feel the way that we do, we work at letting go of the desire and need to get even. Second, **forgiveness is a process, not a one time event.** It takes time to forgive. We don't just wake up one day and everything is gone. Usually, we make a few steps in the direction of forgiveness and then we have a few set backs. The important thing is to be going in the right direction. Sometimes the process won't be totally finished until we sit at the feet of Christ. Third, **because God forgives us and desires for us to forgive ourselves and others, God will always help us to forgive when we ask.** Even Jesus asked for God's help with the issue of forgiveness. From the cross he does not say, "I forgive you," he says, "Father forgive them." All of our ability to forgive has its beginning in God's forgiveness of us. When we remember everything for which God has forgiven us, what we need to forgive in others seems small by comparison. If you are having trouble forgiving someone, first ask God to help you recognize that you have been forgiven and then ask God to forgive those who have hurt you and keep asking for that until your prayer for them opens your own heart to forgive.

For many of us the worst unforgiveness is directed at ourselves, we just can't stop blaming ourselves. In that case, **remember that God has forgiven you and honor God's forgiveness by forgiving yourself.** Keep reminding yourself day after day until you experience forgiveness.

Finally, if these things don't solve the unforgiveness problem in your life it is probably time to seek help and absolution. The church offers a number of private confession and absolution experiences so pick up the phone and seek the comfort of God's word of forgiveness.

LUTHERAN CAMPUS MINISTRY @ UK

A recent decision by the Episcopal Diocese of Lexington and Christ Church Cathedral has brought about a separation of the Lutheran-Episcopal Campus Ministry at the University of Kentucky. Funds were made available to have an Episcopal Priest provide part-time ministry at St. Augustine's Episcopal Chapel at UK which generated a desire to do ministry in a separate but collegial way.

At this time, IGNITE-Lutheran Campus Ministry at UK will continue to occupy office space, provide worship on Sunday evenings, and have access as arranged; all at St. Augustine's. A covenant of building use for LCM's use of the Chapel is being developed through the Bishop's Offices of both the IK Synod and the Episcopal Diocese of Lexington.

What does this mean? IGNITE-Lutheran Campus Ministry continues to provide a 'home away from home' for students at UK. We have welcomed at least 12 new students during the first weeks of this semester through our presence at various UK sponsored events and activities. We provide worship opportunities (5:35pm Sundays), social events (hiking and cosmic bowling), servant opportunities at St. Agnes House (hospitality for persons/families for medical treatment) and 'Kids against Hunger' program organized by Thrivent for Lutherans. LCM seeks to live out the mission of God's Work, Our Hands as we faithfully move forward.
